We came out with a coffee table Souvenir, excellently produced with some classy essays, anecdotes and poems. A detailed biodata of every student was put there. It has come up so well that for the junior batches, it will be a tough act to follow. A copy will be available in the school library.

We are still drunk in the elixir of friendship, camaraderie and bonhomie, this inebriation will last till the next celebration is planned. We are proud to be Xavierites!

St. Xavier in December of 1972, saw the passing out of two batches of students – first of 35 students of All India Higher Secondary (AIHS) and another of 36 students of Indian School Certificate (ISC). Over the past 50 years, these boys, wandered around the world in search of their goals and life.

In December 1997, they celebrated their Silver Jubilee at Ranthambore along with their spouses and children. And now in December 2022 they

once again gathered together with their spouses to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of school passing out.

Their two days of reminiscence with the school class-mates were from 23-25 Dec 2022 at the Umaid Lake Palace Resort at Kalakho (Dist. Dausa) approximately 70 kms from Jaipur on the Agra highway. Painstakingly, they reached out almost everyone all over the world. Coaxed them to leave everything and come over. It started with the sounding of the *Last Post* by the buglers to pay homage to their friends whom they had lost over these years. After the *Rouse*, drinks went into circulation.

His school photograph along with the present family photos, really helped the rest to catch up on their friends.
