

REFLECTIVE MEMOIRS: THE JOURNEY OF THE XAVIERITES OF BATCH 1999

Our Roots: Growing Up in Jaipur as 80s Kids

As we celebrate the silver jubilee of the 1999 batch of Saint Xavier's School, Jaipur, it's a poignant moment to reflect on the experience of growing up in Jaipur during the 90s. Quite a population of Jaipur resided within the historic confines of the walled pink city, a contrasting blend of tradition and the burgeoning pulse of modernity. Even amidst the tumultuous times like the aftermath of the Mandal Commission and the 1992 riots, our innocence remained intact; these cultural markers shaped the resilient and dynamic spirit of our generation. Our days were accompanied by the familiar sounds of Doordarshan and All India Radio. After all, who needed Netflix binge-watching when you had weekly episodes of Mahabharat, Surabhi, Shriman-Shrimati and Shaktiman (our own Indian superhero giving Stan Lee a run for his money!)? We indulged in Gold Spot, Frooti, and Maaza without fussing over the calories in the 2-minute maggi; evenings often dedicated to outdoor games, swapping WWF cards or fantasizing over the latest MTV music videos.

The School Motto: Deus Fortitudo Mea

Who could forget the morning assembly, where the sound of hundreds of voices joined in unison for the morning prayer "Our Father in Heaven", and the school song "Cheer for Xavier's", an anthem that encapsulated our pride in our school motto Deus Fortitudo Mea (God is my strength). The school diary was a trove of spiritual and inspirational songs, such as Rabindranath Tagore's Where The Mind is Without Fear and Ek Hamara Nara (or 'Nada', as invariably many would sing and giggled!). Those melodies, bound within pages, often found us unified in chorus, reminding us of the values we cherish today. An anecdote many would relate regarding the school diary: the panic setting in as the teacher writes a bad

remark in my diary. The smirky face of your partner in crime, Ah, the art of forging signatures—a rite of passage for many students!

The Playground of Dreams: Sports and Infrastructure

Saint Xavier's school boasts extensive fields and top-notch sports facilities, a paradise for the athletically inclined. Our vast playgrounds nurtured the talent of many who went on to become top-class sportsmen at individual sports such as Judo, Taekwondo, Swimming to team sports such as Soccer, Basketball, Volleyball and Cricket. The impressive auditorium resonated with applause for countless dramatics, debates and musical events that fostered public speaking and artistic expression. Here, infrastructure was not merely about buildings and grounds; it was about constructing futures, molding us into the individuals we are today.
